The continuing help of volunteers with clean-up days, office work and a myriad of other important tasks is also essential to the success of the project.

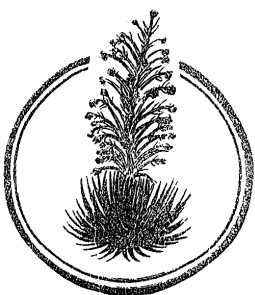
