SABER DONATIONS FUND MHS HISTORIC BUILDING REPORT

Twenty years ago, when Friends stepped in to rescue the derelict campus at Old Maui High School, our goal was to create a future for the school that would honor its history and its accomplished alumni.

We soon learned there were many challenges to rehabilitating the century-old campus. The school's water and sanitation infrastructures were gone, as were many original classrooms, teachers cottages, ag and athletic Quonsets, the much-loved "Barn," and more.

Luckily, a substantial core of the educational facilities that were part of the school remained, and although they suffered from decades of deterioration, Friends knew their survival was essential to future re-use of the historic school. We needed to save them, and we needed advice.

Thanks to your generous donations, we were able to retain preservation specialists, Architects Hawaii Limited (AHL), contracting with them to evaluate existing conditions and prioritize maintenance recommendations for nine of the remaining school buildings.

Last spring, AHL's team of architects and consulting engineers visited the school, inspected and photographed each building, and compiled their findings in a 77-page guide detailing recommendations for "actions needed to prevent further deterioration of the historic structures." Their "Old Maui High School Stabilizaton Report" complies with historic rehabilitation standards, and offers hope for many more years of useful life for these important Maui High School buildings.

Mahalo to the generous donors who help Friends carry out our important preservation work!



Friends and MISC Dedicated to Preservation, Rehabilitation

The effects of the past two years' COVID-19 restrictions nearly brought Friends' activities at the H'poko campus to a halt. It was difficult to conduct programs and outreach in the face of mandates which limited site access, tours, volunteer help, and even board meetings.

During that period, the presence of MISC - the Maui Invasive Species Committee - at the campus was an enormous boost, as they generously pitched in to assist with maintenance, upgrading the former agricultural and athletic fields and structures, and developed their own baseyard and office.

As long-time protectors of Maui's native ecosystem and environment, MISC personnel have the skills, experience and equipment needed to ensure the Exceptional Trees and original campus landscape are cared for, and that the large, isolated MHS campus is protected and secure from vandalism and harm, 24/7.

We were especially sad to discontinue programs established to connect the legacy and history of the original MHS campus with students (continued on page 4)
